I. Bikeway & Pedestrian Items

- A. Bicycle & Pedestrian portion of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan: The consultant is still gathering data to include in the report. The steering committee has met to discuss the goals and expectations for the plan. Identifying reliable data to base the goals will be an ongoing process as data collection methods and focuses continue to evolve. A draft plan will be coming out for review sometime later this year.
- **B.** Vision statement: Kim is working with staff in the public works department to develop materials that can be shared on the city and greenway websites. These items will address several topics related to shared-use paths development and maintenance. She would like to include a vision statement in the materials to guide staff in the decision-making process and inform the public about what they can expect.

The goal is to provide a well-connected shared-use path system that provides a reasonably uniform surface for walking, biking, and other non-motorized transportation and ADA accessibility throughout the year.

Discussion on including "Safety" as part of the statement but decided not to at this time. Defining safety would be difficult because everyone interprets it differently.

II. Greenway Items

- **A. Ski trail expansion potential:** The cross-country ski route will be expanded further south of 47th Avenue South this season. The first option is to use the existing trail through the woods. This is the one that mosquito control staff uses for spraying in the summer. The second option is to groom along the tree line. Snow levels and equipment flexibility will determine the final route.
- **B.** Educational campaign re: bikes, scooters, and utvs: Staff is working on a brochure and campaign to educate residents about where bikes, electric scooters, and motorized vehicles can be ridden. The current GF ordinance does not allow for electric scooters. Staff is looking into updating the ordinance to be consistent with other ordinances.

C. Project updates

i. Floodwall area redesign project update: An open house was held on Tuesday, October 4, at Town Square. Turnout was small, but the consultants from RDG Planning & Design were able to develop three draft concept plans. The steering committee reviewed the draft designs and provided input. The next step is to expand on those drafts and bring three concepts to the public for discussion.

Funding for the project will come from the Greenway budget, and work will be done in phases to allow for the pursuit of external funding.

ii. Social media campaign: GF staff is working on a year-round public service advertising campaign to educate residents about various topics. Some topics will be about stormwater, seasonal leaf pick up, greenway and trail items, and other relative topics. The campaign will use electronic billboards, social media, and some advertising in the GF Herald.

Let's be courteous

Whether riding on a shared-use path, street, or sidewalk, please obey all applicable laws and be courteous to your fellow traveler.

- Signal your intentions. A quick "passing on your left," ringing bell, or hand signal (required on the street) will let other path users know your intentions.
- Give some room. Always ride single-file on streets and when encountering others on shared-use paths. Motor vehicles should give cyclists at least 3' of room when passing.
- Watch your speed. Fast speeds are great on streets but not on shared-use paths. .
